Guidelines for Anne Dias Griffin and Kenneth C. Griffin Harvard University Fellowships Academic Year 2024-2025

The Anne Dias Griffin and Kenneth C. Griffin Harvard University Fellowships support students from France who are enrolling in a full-time, in-residence master's degree program at the:

- Harvard Business School
- Harvard Kennedy School
- or the joint-degree program between these two schools.

Applicants should be long-term residents of France with significant connection to the country.

Recipients will be selected for their outstanding leadership potential and academic achievement. The awards will cover a portion of the cost of attendance for up to two years in a degree program. The fellowships are made possible by the generosity of the Anne Dias Griffin and Kenneth C. Griffin Harvard University Fellowship Fund.

The recipients will be known as Dias Fellows. They will be invited to join a network of fellows and to participate in events hosted by Anne Dias Griffin. Fellowship funding is not linked to participation; however, recipients are encouraged to consider this network as a benefit for their future careers.

Fellowship candidates must apply to and be accepted to an academic degree program at the university independently from this fellowship application. Admissions applications should be submitted prior to submitting a fellowship application. Candidates do not need to know their admissions status in order to apply for this award. Admission to the university does not guarantee a fellowship award. Applicants must apply for this fellowship prior to enrolling at Harvard University. Students who are currently enrolled at Harvard are not eligible to apply.

Fellowship recipients must be enrolled in full-time, in-residence degree programs which run during the regular academic year. Students applying to part-time, summer-only, or on-line programs are not eligible for consideration.

All applicants who wish to be considered for financial aid must follow the separate procedures and deadlines outlined by the Harvard school in which they hope to enroll.

The online application requires the following materials:

- Application form
- Resume or Curriculum Vitae
- Statement of Purpose: In a short essay of 1,000 words, please discuss your plan of study at Harvard University and how it relates to your career goals.

The deadline to submit the online application and all supplemental materials is **March 1, 2024**. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.
